# A PASSION FOR GIFTS SINCE 1775

Royal Copenhagen porcelain and the passion for gifts. The two have gone hand-in-hand since the company's very beginning in 1775. The precious Flora Danica porcelain was originally designed in 1790 as a gift for Catharina the Great and remains the ultimate present to this very day. And after Lord Nelson's hard-worn victory in Denmark in the Battle of Copenhagen, he bought a Royal Copenhagen dinnerware set for his beloved Lady Hamilton. It has always been a sign of good diplomatic practice, and good taste to give fine porcelain as gifts. Even today, important celebrations within the Danish Royal Family are marked by a personal gift from Royal Copenhagen.

In Denmark, the home of Royal Copenhagen, our porcelain is a feature on wish lists for birthdays, weddings and other special occasions.

Royal Copenhagen is and has always been about giving more than is expected.

About giving a gift of great quality and craftsmanship that conveys
feelings of love, friendship, gratitude, desire and affection.

About giving something to be cherished.

The Royal Copenhagen gift is an entire experience; the distinct wrapping alone embodies elegance, luxury and the anticipation of something quite lovely, to be enjoyed, treasured and then passed on to future generations.

When you give a piece of beautifully wrapped Royal Copenhagen porcelain,

you become part of our ongoing tale...where the act of giving is a wonderful gesture, a loving thought and a wish for happiness.





In the 18th century, it was customary among kingdoms, aristocrats and princes to present one another with fine porcelain gifts, in the name of diplomacy. In 1801, in celebration of his victory in the battle of Copenhagen, Lord Nelson showered his beloved Lady Hamilton with presents from the Royal Porcelain Factory. The Danes may have lost the battle but a love of Danish porcelain was victorious.

The original Flora Danica service, consisting of 1802 pieces, was probably ordered as a gift for the Russian tsarina Catharine II. In spite of the defence alliance

between Denmark and Russia, Denmark had let Russia down during the war between Sweden and Russia. To make amends, a significant diplomatic gift was thus required from the Danish king. In 1796, the tsarina died before the service was completed. The Danish regent continued production of Flora Danica, and later expanded from 80 to 100 place settings. In 1802, however, production was stopped and the whole set delivered to the Royal Palace, where it is still used when celebrating special occasions; perhaps the most precious porcelain service in the world.

The Royal Copenhagen Flagship Store in central Copenhagen is more than just a shop with beautiful porcelain. It is a living museum; a retrospective exhibition that showcases Royal Copenhagen's enduring respect for tradition while also illustrating how the company has spearheaded Nordic design and craftsmanship since its inception.

When it first opened, the shop on Amagertorv was frequented by men; it was the master of the household who purchased the family porcelain as he was the one who earned money and controlled the housekeeping finances. Later, the lady of the house would be the one to visit the shop, in the company of her peers. Christmas was an especially busy time, when presents would be ordered, beautifully wrapped and delivered to Copenhagen households. Even today, for many

people, it is not Christmas before they have visited Royal Copenhagen to browse and admire the shop's Christmas décor and table settings.

The Danish Royal family continue their relationship with Royal Copenhagen. In 2003 HRH Queen Margrethe was in charge of the Christmas table setting at the Flagship store. Royal Copenhagen's beautiful gift wrapping also has royal connections. Inspired by origami paper art from Asia, the late Queen Ingrid suggested gift wrapping that would unfold like a flower when opened. Wrapping the boxes in royal blue paper and decorative ribbon, requires skill and dexterity and creates a piece of art itself. Giving a gift of this beautifully-wrapped Royal Copenhagen is an unique experience; like giving a little piece of Copenhagen, to be kept forever.



### THINGS THAT INSPIRE ME


- 1: Ceramics especially Japanese raku ware and Mexican terracotta pottery.

### THINGS THAT INSPIRE ME

- **1:** My instrument the double bass. Its natural sound resonates deeply and continues to inspire me.
- **2:** A grand piano my first instrument. I was drawn to the many different musical notes that could be played simultaneously and the endless colours it could create.
- **3:** Every movement, whether a dancer, a leaf in the wind, an opening door or a car driving by has an organic rhythm or pulse which I search for. It inspires me.
- **4:** A woman's body, because it is unique, whatever shape it is. There's a softness and never-ending mystery, like a desert where I want to see what's over the next sand dune.
- 5: Art, because I love seeing and feeling what cannot be expressed in words.
- 6: Cities particularly New York, Tokyo, Copenhagen and Hanoi.
- **7:** James Bond (yes really). He is always at home, no matter which situation or location he might be in.
- **8:** Albums of any genre, new or old, obscure or classic; jazz, classical, opera etc.
- **9:** Mint tea as it reminds me of my childhood.
- 10: Silence nothing clears your mind like emptiness.

Through the senses of taste, touch and smell, his meals take many forms and create anticipation, happiness and conversation.





### THINGS THAT INSPIRE ME

- 1: Inspiring ingredients such as Danish lamb from South Jutland and Danish fish or seafood. I like to go to Vedbæk Harbour and buy lumpsucker fresh off the fishing boats.
- 2: Sensuality & moods especially the feeling of cooking in another culture. I have travelled and eaten in different places, even around bonfires. I love the feeling when people get together to eat a great meal; it's a special atmosphere.
- **3:** Tastes such as freshly baked sourdough, sea salt and olive oil with grassy and spicy notes.
- **4:** Simplicity in food style. I like when you can see and taste which ingredients were used. A simple meal; a carrot baked in the oven, served with homemade cream and herbs, and crisp rye bread.
- **5:** Seasons. I love that each season brings different foods, such as the autumn's apples and root vegetables.
- **6:** Contrasts; raw and cooked, soft and crunchy, sour and rich.
- 7: Great music.
- 8: My family.
- **9:** Craftsmanship I honor great craftsmanship. It awakens thoughts and a kind of inspiring spirituality in me.

### MEMORABLE TABLE SETTINGS


Throughout time, human beings around the world have celebrated occasions by gathering together around tables and sharing special dinner. Table setting is a practice that goes back over a thousand years, to before the medieval era. It marks the occasion and is a ritual in itself; each item is laid out in anticipation of the conviviality that will follow

For over 241 years, Royal Copenhagen has played an important role at table settings for special occasions around the world; from formal aristocratic events of times past to more modern casual meals between friends. Each plate and serving dish enables the diner to be present to the food, the occasion, and the memorable moment.





in the 1700s. The service is only produced to order; each piece is picked from over 3000 different Danish wild flowers and plants listed in the Flora Danica. The astonishing detail of the hand painting and the perfect quality of the underlying porcelain make each item a piece to be treasured.



### FLOWERS ARE FOREVER


Occasions do not always need to involve many people to be special. Just you and your loved one can enjoy an intimate moment and celebrate a memorable day at a table set for two. Dating from the golden age of porcelain in the 18th century, Flora Danica represents over 3000 Nordic wild plants from the Flora Danica encyclopedia, painstakingly painted by hand onto the precious porcelain. It was originally commissioned by the Danish king and intended as a gift for the Empress Catherine the Great of Russia, an enthusiastic collector of porcelain. As Catherine died before the dinner service was completed, it was first used at the birthday banquet for the king Christian VII in 1803. It remains one of the world's most prestigious and precious dinner services in production today.



## UNWRAPPING THE ART OF THE GIFT

Like the fine porcelain that inspired the classic
Royal Copenhagen Blue Fluted Plain design,
the art of gift wrapping originated in ancient China,
where paper was invented in 2<sup>nd</sup> century BC.
We pay tribute to the art of gift wrapping.

Just as gift-giving can be ceremonial, so too can be the wrapping of the gift. The paper, the details and the way it is presented tell a story of all the thought and intentions that have gone into the gift. For the recipient, an artfully wrapped gift can be as exciting and memorable as the gift inside. Royal Copenhagen gift wrapping is as special as the porcelain itself. When undone, the paper opens up like a flower, a technique that was originally developed by Royal Copenhagen on a suggestion by Queen Ingrid, who was inspired by origami paper art.

Designed by Louise Campbell, White Elements and her other Elements series use familiar Royal Copenhagen elements such as fluting and lace in a subtle and yet distinctive style. Blue Elements features a captivating design in Royal Copenhagen's cobalt blue and is a lovely contrast to White Elements; both series are classic gifts for any occasion.





The Blue Fluted Plain cup is an iconic Royal Copenhagen piece. It features the traditional Blue Fluted Plain design, which is as graceful and captivating now as it was when it was launched in 1775. Eternally classic.

The Blue Fluted Mega vase has a simple and elegant form that is the perfect canvas for the playfully magnified flowers from the original Blue Fluted Plain design.













Royal Copenhagen has been a part of Copenhagen's history for centuries. Despite the changing times, it remains an icon of art and design. The Royal Copenhagen Flagship Store is still in the heart of Copenhagen, towering over Amagertorv with its beautiful façade and still close to the very spot where it all began in 1775. Royal Copenhagen is of noble birth as its name suggests. It was largely founded through the support of the Danish monarchy,

spearheaded by Queen Dowager, Juliane Marie. From the very beginning, Juliane Marie decided that every single porcelain piece leaving the Royal Porcelain Factory would carry a three-waved stamp on the back; the waves symbolising Denmark's three waterways; the Little Belt, the Great Belt and the Sound. At the same time, she introduced the royal crown stamp, which has served as a constant reminder of this early royal connection.



## BLUE FLUTED HALF LACE

Designed in 1888 by Arnold Krog
